BALANCED BUDGET PASSED

The Board of Education unanimously adopted a balanced budget at its September meeting for the current fiscal year. High School District 214 hosted a meeting in September with representatives from each of its feeder school districts. The meeting covered three topics: state and federal updates, partnerships with Harper College, and beginning conversations around potential changes to the school calendar.

DISTRICT ENERGY SAVINGS

Ten years ago, the Board implemented Energy Conservation Guidelines. Since then, CCSD21 has saved more than \$3.4 million on energy expenses. The environmental impact of these savings translates into 3,703 cars not being driven for a year, or having 455,734 seedlings grow for 10 years! Additionally, each CCSD21 building is Energy Star certified by the federal government.

Safety Procedures
